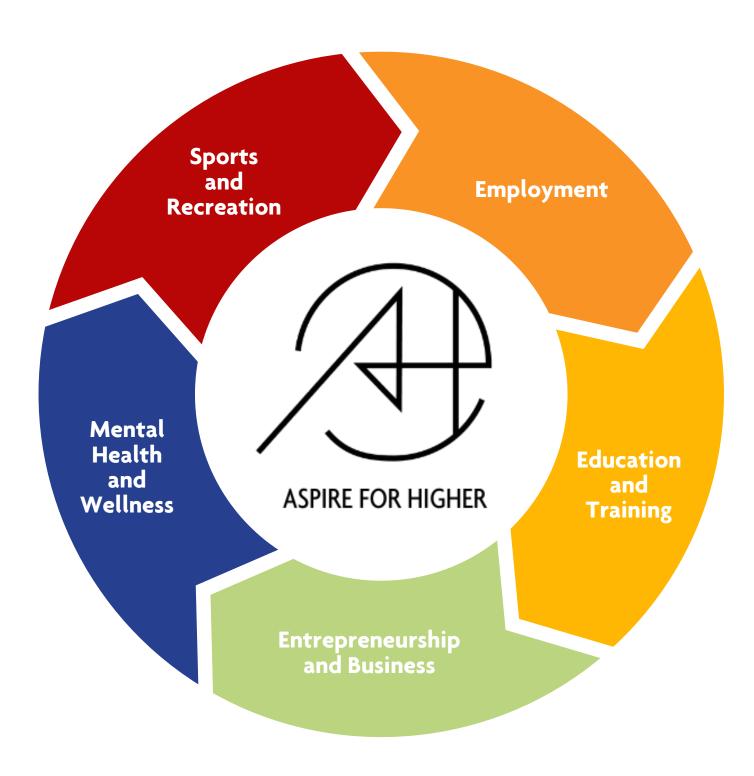

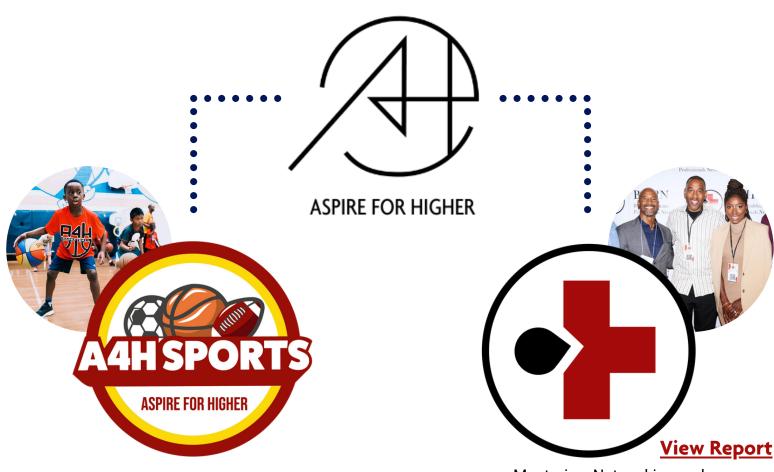

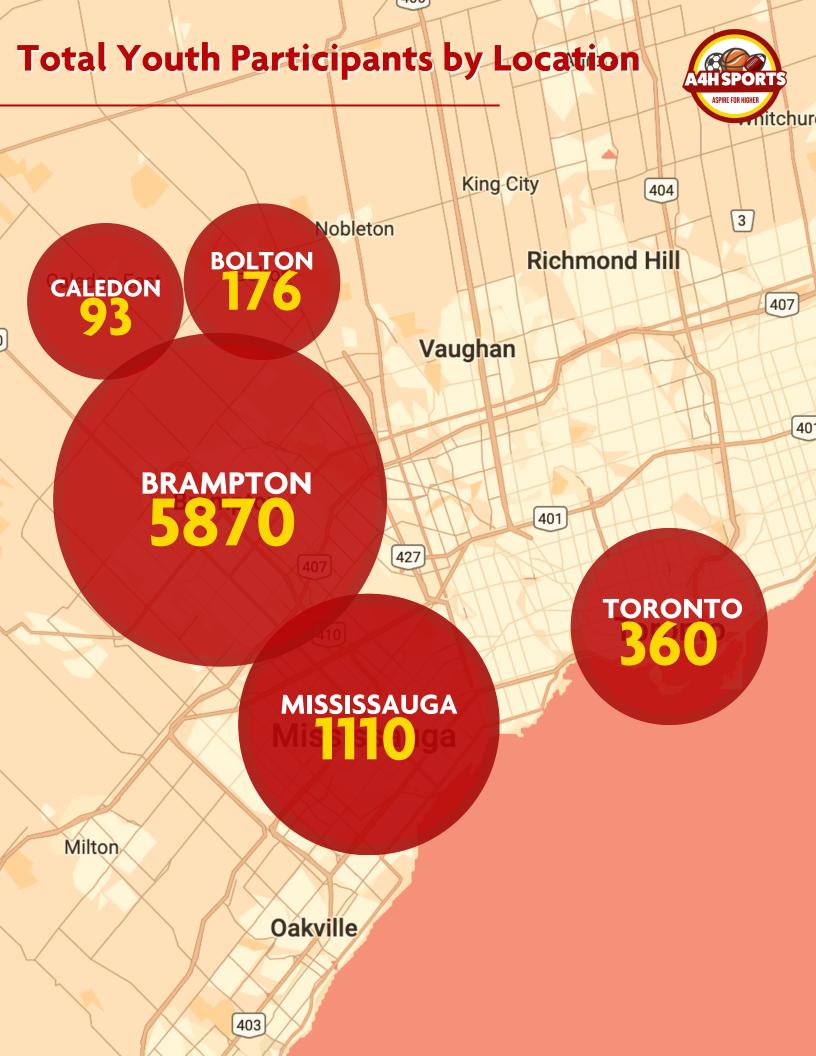

## **A4H Summer Camps**





#### **Dufferin-Peel School Board**

Aspire for Higher partnered with Dufferin-Peel to support their camps by providing multi-sport, STEAM, and mental wellness sessions for students in grades 3-8. These sessions were held at two locations, each accommodating over 100 kids, offering a balanced focus on physical fitness, creative learning, and mental health. The partnership aimed to engage and empower the youth through a well-rounded camp experience.





#### **Toronto Catholic School Board**

Aspire for Higher partnered with the Toronto Board to deliver multi-sport and mental wellness sessions for students in grades 3-8. These sessions promoted physical activity through various sports, while also focusing on mental health and well-being. The goal was to engage youth in both physical fitness and personal growth.





#### **Peel School Board**

Aspire for Higher Sports successfully partnered with the Peel School Board at their Africentric Camp to deliver physical literacy and wellness sessions to campers in Kindergarten to Grade 6. The young participants engaged in a variety of activities, including running and dodging games, target games, soccer, and basketball. These sessions helped the children develop essential teamwork and cooperation skills while fostering a growing passion for physical activity. Additionally, they learned about the importance of maintaining a healthy body, laying the foundation for lifelong wellness habits!





#### **Skilled Trade Truck Activation**

The Skills Ontario Skilled Trade and Trades Truck Event in Brampton aimed to inspire Black youth between 10 and 17 years old to pursue careers in the trades. Over 200 students participated in hands-on activities, including building birdhouses and learning about career pathways in the trades.

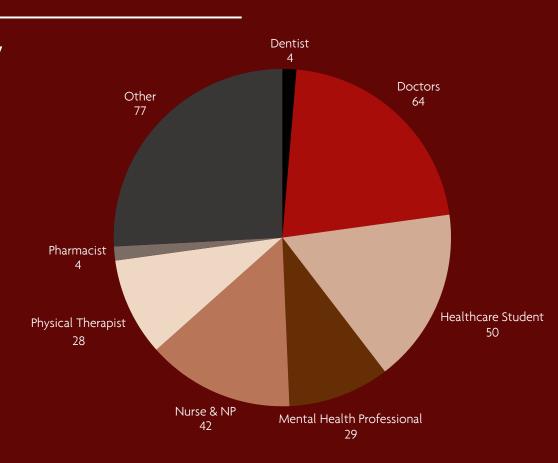

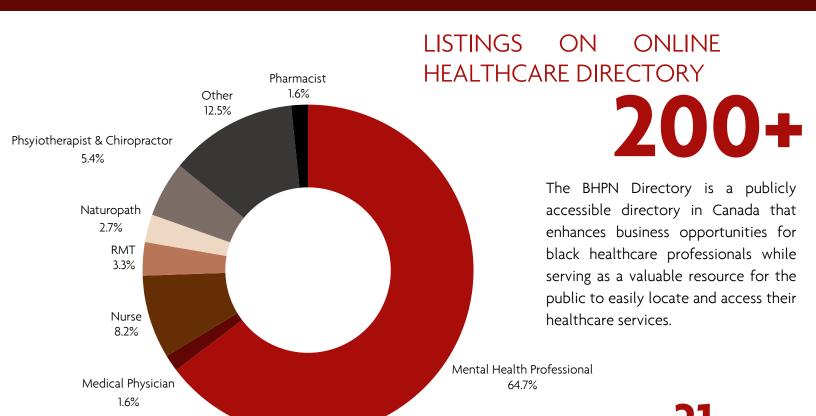
